This has allowed researchers to look back to the initial colonisation of Australia – some 50,000 years ago, and the major cultural and environmental events that took place prior to European arrival. Prof. Alan Cooper has played a central role in the development of the field of ancient DNA. He sequenced the first complete genome of an extinct species, two mitochondrial genomes of giant New Zealand moa. He established the Australian Centre for Ancient DNA as an Australian Research Council Federation Fellow at the University of Adelaide, has been an ARC Future Fellow, and is now an ARC Laureate Fellow.
